SUBJECT: Weekly Update

Special Budget Meeting, June 30

Due to delays in the budget review, there will be a special City Council meeting on Tuesday, June 30 to adopt the budget. Since this is one of the dates allocated to the School Board, the special meeting will not be broadcast live, but will be broadcast on a delayed basis.

Wireless Telecommunications Facilities

The California State Assembly's Local Government Committee has unanimously voted Assembly Bill 57 out of committee, moving the bill forward. If adopted in its current form, AB 57 would "deem approved" an application for new wireless towers and facilities if: (1) the city fails to approve or disapprove the application within the time periods established by the FCC (150 days for new facilities, and 90 days for conforming collocations) (2) all public notices regarding the application have been provided. The law would also apply to applications to collocate additional wireless facilities and devices on or adjacent to existing facilities. This is more strict than the federal standard under which there is some limited ability to show good cause for delays.

Sarzotti Park Master Plan

Work is now underway on the update to the master plan for Sarzotti Park. This week the consultant and members of the Parks and Recreation Commission and City staff met to map out the initial steps and the public outreach that will be necessary for the effort. As we schedule public outreach events, we will be sure to announce those here, on the website, and by other means.

Office Specialist Recruitment

We are continuing to accept applications for the Office Specialist position, through June 15. Depending on the qualifications of whoever is hired, we will fill this position either as an Office Specialist I or II. For more information see the City Jobs page on the City of Ojai website.

Recreation Staff Ready for Summer

The City has hired Trevor Cox as its second part-time recreation specialist, ready in time for the very busy summer season. The hire brings the Recreation Department to a fully-staffed level. In other news, staff is pleased to announced that we had more than \$1,300 in class registrations on the day of our open house last month. The event was successful, we feel, and plans are already underway for our third annual recreation open house next spring. Staff is busy getting ready for the ten-week summer program and the six-week aquatics program, which start next week. There are currently over 100 participants registered in swim lessons.
